Spiritual check-in time: We've been on the Lenten journey for several weeks now. How are you feeling?

As we moved from Ash Wednesday to the first Sunday we found ourselves out in the wilderness with Jesus following His baptism. This was not a cozy pre-planned retreat with comfy bed linens, a relaxing activity schedule, and three planned

meals and snacks whenever we wanted. The gospel of Mark tells us that the Spirit drove out Jesus into the wilderness. This phrase, drive out, is not a chauffeur gently taking a passenger, according to the original Greek it can even be

with a notion of violence. So switch in whatever word makes most sense to you: Expelled, Casted Out, Banished, Yeeted, etc. If we're going with Jesus on this journey, and find ourselves launched into the desert, it can be disorienting and we need to find our footing. We find ourselves in the delicate balance of seeing our destination and moving towards it, but not racing so quickly that we skip over the work of Lent. So again, I ask you. How are you feeling?

This Lenten season I find myself all over the place. From the incredible work of ministry, walking with you in the hardest moments of your life, parsonage maintenance, spiritual tug of war to find that balance of being present, and oh yeah, preparing for a baby! Y'all, it can be very disorienting to be in the wilderness, but it's important for us to remember that love draws near to us. Love draws near not to fix the chaos or even lift

down to our level in the muck and mire, and literally bleed with and for us. Talk about disorienting. Jesus reminds us that those who choose to be His followers will need to take up their cross, but it will not be unassisted. With that in mind: How

are vou feeling?

The wilderness of Lent is not meant just for us to feel shaken up and confused, but for us to take time for spiritual practices that tame our hearts in the process. I've found that our daily prayer time, while not always perfect, has been a steadying time

for my own soul. In the first weekend of March, our confirmation students will be practicing retreat with other United Methodist students, to grow, to learn, to rest. What practices have you found helpful this year? Maybe you're fasting, or studying scripture a little deeper, perhaps you've found time for solitude or silence. If you haven't yet, it's not too late to start! If you're curious about a new practice, I'd highly recommend the book Sacred Rhythms by Ruth Haley Barton. Take time within your week at the very least, if not every day, to ask yourself that question: How are you feeling? Use it as an opportunity to assess where you are in the wilderness, reorient yourself to the destination, and continue moving towards it without speeding up the process of the work in your soul. God bless each of you in the wilderness, on your journey, and as you reach the destination of the empty tomb and the risen Christ! Pastor Taylor

ARE YOU LISTENING?

As we get older, time seems to go by much quicker. Here we are in Lent. For us we know the story and we look for-

ward to the Risen Lord. Too many people, and the numbers are getting higher, are not listening to God. My mother was a great example of a good listening living by her faith. All Christian seasons were important to our family, and attending Wednesday services was a requirement. One Wednesday night, I told my mother I couldn't go because I had hockey practice. She

was not happy, but she left it up to me. Obviously, I chose hockey. When I got to the outdoor rink a couple of blocks away, there was no practice. I missed the memo. Although I could have stayed at the park, it didn't take me long to get back home and change into my church clothes. My mother didn't say much, but I knew she was proud. What was God's plan for both of us that night?

There are many of these situations in our daily life, when the Holy Spirit tugs at our heart to do the right thing, especially to listen. When we sit in church and listen to the scripture, music, prayers, and message, we are hearing things that are meant to inspire us. For me, I notice times when the words are read, or are shared, helps make me remember what I have done, or should have done in the past. It's a reminder that I may have not been listening as closely as perhaps I should. You might walk out of church feeling lifted by what you heard. When I hear the interlude to the song Fairest Lord Jesus I sit a little straighter and not afraid to sing louder because that is my favorite song, and has been since I was very little. Listening is so important. Without action listening is not finished. In the back of our hymnal, is the closing prayer that we sing occasionally. I have also used parts of it in my closing of a service.

And now the time has come for us to leave this place;

Guide us and protects and lead us in thy grace. Wherever life may take us as we go our separate ways,

Help us share with others the things we've shared today.

May the peace of God the Father, and the love of Christ, His Son,

Guide us in the days ahead and strengthen us, each one.

May the blessings of the spirit fill us from within; God bless us and return us to this fellowship once again.

Hebrews 2:1 "Therefore we must pay much closer attention to what we have heard, lest we drift away from it."

Since we come to church to learn about God and His love, as well as to refill our bucket with HIs words of peace and joy, we need to not just take what we have learned and put it in our hip pocket or purse along with the Sunday bulletin. We need to keep listening to those words as they bounce around our mind and pop-up occasionally. What is it that we are called to do? If we really want to know God's words, then we have to take action. We need to share what we have heard. We need to apply what we have learned. We cannot live God's words just by listen-



ing, but rather by doing. What can you do in the next month to show you really are listening? What can you do so people will recognize you as a Christian filled with the Holy Spirit? What is it that you really want to say to others so they too can know God like you do? In your world, whose life needs to feel God's love? So are we really listening to God? We

know that HIs words have a purpose. God wants us to be a guide, a beacon for others to see God's love and mercy. There are so many that really need to feel what you do on Sunday. We are not children who listen with one ear and let it out the other. God's word is like glue. It sticks to those who are open and want to listen.

Isaiah 30:21 "And your ears shall hear a word behind you, saying, 'This is the way, walk in it."

You have read the word listen 10 times in this message. My hope is that when you hear the word "listen" in the coming weeks, God will be tapping you on the shoulder reminding you to take his word and share it with others. If you would like, I'd be happy to know how many of you do experience this wonderful reminder from God. AMEN!
